

PHYSICIAN DIES

DR. WILLIAMS SERVICE WILL BE MONDAY

Prominent Doctor and Real Estate Develop- er Succumbs

Dr. T. E. Williams, 74, prominent Shreveport physician and extensive real estate developer, died at 1 p.m. yesterday at a local sanitarium following an illness of a few months.

Funeral services have been tentatively set for 4 p.m. tomorrow at the Osborn funeral chapel, with the Rev. William A. Alexander, pastor of the First Presbyterian church, officiating. Final Masonic rites will be conducted at the graveside, and burial will be in the Forest Park cemetery.

Dr. Williams was born in Hillsboro, Ohio, on June 23, 1873, the son of Daniel and Mary Hatcher Williams. He graduated from Hillsboro college, the Chicago Homeopathic Medical college and the Jefferson Medical college at Philadelphia, Pa. His studies also included specialized training in Vienna, Austria.

Moving to Shreveport in 1906, Dr. Williams was a practicing physician here for many years, being associated with Dr. L. H. Pirkle for 25 years at the Tri-State clinic. For the past seven years he has conducted only a limited practice at his home.

One of the founders of the Tri-State hospital, which was erected in 1924, Dr. Williams was an active member of the First Presbyterian church, being a past president of the Men's Bible class there; a Shriner and member of the Masonic lodge No. 115; a member of the advisory board of Charity hospital; a member of the board of directors of the Pines sanatorium, and president of the Louisiana homeopathic state board of medical examiners.

Dr. Williams is survived by his widow, Mrs. Oma Glover Williams; two daughters, Mrs. Lucille Nipper and Mrs. Robert Neff; one son, Thomas E. Williams, Jr., and seven grandchildren, all of Shreveport.
