Expected Receipts

Receipts from the state treasury for the year ended on June 30, 1940, were \$10,100,000. This was \$1,000,000 less than the receipts for the year ended on June 30, 1939, which were \$11,100,000. The decrease was due to a reduction in receipts from the state treasury of \$1,000,000, and an increase in receipts from the federal government of \$1,000,000.
